STRATEGIC PLANNING



Situated in the heart of the 'Garden of England', Ashford, Tenterden and the surrounding picturesque villages offer the ideal setting for leisurely cycle tours. The 'Parish Pedals' pack, which is available from local TICs, gives details of attractive circular routes away from the busy main roads, while Ashford and Tenterden are now linked by a signed cycle trail - regional route 18. This 12 mile route, which has undergone a thorough safety audit, passes close to many tourist attractions, such as the Kent and East Sussex Railway, as well as numerous country pubs and tea rooms



Situés au coeur du 'Jardin d'Angleterre', Ashford, Tenterden et les pittoresques villages environnants offrent un cadre idéal pour d'agréables promenades en vélo. Le dossier 'Parish Pedals', disponible, auprès des syndicats d'initiatives de la région, fournit des renseignements sur les jolies routes circulaires, à l'écart de la circulation, alors que les villes d'Ashford et Tenterden sont maintenant reliées par une piste cyclable clairement indiquée, la route régionale 18. Cette route d'une longueur de 19 km a subi une inspection de sécurité rigoureuse et passe à proximité de nombreuses attractions touristiques, comme le chemin de fer du Kent et du East Sussex, ainsi que de nombreux pubs et salons de thé rustiques.

Ashford, Tenterden en de schilerachtige dorpjes in de omgeving zijn gelegen in het hart van de 'Tuin van Engeland' en bieden de ideale achtergrond voor ontspannende fietstochten. Het 'Parish Pedals' pakket, dat verkrijgbaar us van plaatselijke TICs [VVV's], geeft bijzonderheden over aantrekkelijke cikeltochten op een afstand van de drukke hoofdwegen, terwijl Ashford en Tenterden nu verbonden zijn door een fietspad met richtingborden - regionale route 18. Deze ongeveer 19 km lange route, die een grondige veiligheidscontrole heeft ondergaan, gaat vlak langs vele bezienswaardigheden, zoals de Kent en Oost Sussex Spoorlijn, en ook langs een groot aantal landelijke pubs en tearooms.

Im Herzen des 'Gartens von England' liegen Ashford, Tenterden und ihre malerischen Nachbardörfer, deren ideale Lage zu gemächlichen Radtouren geradezu einlädt. Im 'Parish-Pedal-Pack', erhältlich beim örtlicheb Fremdenverkehrsamt, finden Sie Einzelheiten zu wunderschönen Rundwegen, die weit ab der viel befahrenen Hauptstraflen liegen, während Ashford und Tenterden seit kurzem durch einen ausgeschilderten Radweg verbunden sind die regionale Route 18. Diese etwa 19 km lange Route, welche einer gründlichen Sicherheitsüberprüfung unterzogen wurde, führt direkt an vielen Touristenattraktionen vorbei, eiw z. B. die Kent und East Sussex Railway sowie zahlreiche Country Pubs und Teestuben.

ASHFORD TO TENDERDEN CYCLE ROUTE 18

Follow the numbered green dots on the map:

1. Your journey starts at **Ashford International** (Connex South Eastern domestic station). On exiting the station turn right towards the car park, cross the river to the signed cycle paths, and follow signs towards Victoria Park. After passing under the railway, when the cycle path ends, carefully cross Newtown Road, turn right and cycle along the road. Bearing left, cross the road to rejoin the cycle path. At the end of the cycle path, cross over Beaver Road and turn right. Cycle along the road for a short distance and almost immediately turn left to rejoin the cycle path.

Continue along the cycle path, crossing the bridge and through the cycle barriers to Victoria Park, following the Great Stour river for approximately 1.5 miles until it ends at Brookfield Road. After crossing the road turn right to immediately rejoin the cycle path which goes around Singleton Lake, following signs to Great Chart village. When the cycle path ends, turn left into Bucksford Lane and continue to the end of the road. At the junction, turn right on to Tithe Barn Lane and almost immediately left into Singleton Hill.

2. Once on Singleton Hill, on your left you will pass the Singleton Centre, a group of shops and the Singleton Barn pub. Continue up the hill for about ½ mile until you start to leave the houses behind you, then take the next turning on the left followed by the next turning on the right. The road then starts to go downhill as you leave Ashford behind, passing through Chilmington Green with its farms and pretty cottages.

- 3. At the bottom on the hill you will come to a T-junction. Turn left towards Shadoxhurst and Kingsnorth and head along this road taking the next right turn onto a country lane. Travel along the lane for 1 mile to another T-junction, turn left towards Shadoxhurst village. Turn right at the next T-junction, opposite the Kings Head pub. Continue along this lane, passing a garage on your right and Church Lane on your left.
- 4. Take the next available right, signposted High Halden. Whilst cycling along this lane you will pass woodland on your left and farms on your right. Then you come to a crossroad, after checking for traffic go straight across. Continue on for 1½ miles to the next crossroads, continue straight on again.

- 5. The road bends several times here so take care. After the last bend, the road starts to do downhill through a picturesque avenue of oak trees. As the road levels out you will come to a sweeping right hand bend turn left into Harbourne Lane.
- 6. Once in Harbourne Lane follow the road round to the right, passing arable fields and then bearing left into Pond Wood in the spring this wood is a mass of bluebells and wood anemones. Once through the wood the road bends to the left and then passes farm land to another T-junction/ Take the right fork turning into Swain Road towards St. Michaels.
- 7. As you continue up Swain Road you will come to a turning on your left marked Ox Lane. Here you need to decide whether you will turn left to Tenterden (2 miles) or go straight on to Tunbridge Wells (32 miles).
- 8. **FOR TENTERDEN** turn left into Ox Lane and continue along until you come to the Fat Ox pub and a T-junction. Please take extreme care when joining the road as the A28 is very busy. Turn left and go up the hill. This road is narrow so we advise you to dismount and push your bike to the top of the hill about 100 metres until the road widens. Remount and follow the road into Tenterden High Street.




When leaving Tenterden head down the High Street in the direction of Rolvenden. Follow this road for ½ mile, passing the William Caxton pub on your left. Take the next right, signposted A228 to Cranbrook, go down the hill and over the railway crossing. Take the next right. Follow this lane for some distance around a sharp right hand bend until you come to a triangular warning sign with a picture of a cow. Turn left here to follow route 18 to Tunbridge Wells (approx 30 miles). Alternatively, for Ashford go straight on into St Michaels village to the Crown pub and the T-junction with the A28. Turn right onto the A28, taking care at this busy junction, then turn immediately left into Swain Road following the signs back to Ashford.

10. **FOR TUNBRIDGE WELLS** (by-passing Tenterden) continue straight on along Swain Road to the T-junction with the A28. Go straight across into Grange Road, heading up the hill out of the village for 1 mile, taking a right turn at Silcocks dairy farm and then down the hill to Tunbridge Wells.
